**Ozark Mountain Legacy Young Leaders** Institute (OMLYLI) is a curated experience for outstanding students from 12 different high schools throughout the region. OMLYLI is designed to improve skills, increase knowledge, and enhance the impact of area youth through principled leadership and civic involvement.

The purpose of **OMLYLI** is to identify. empower, and introduce young leaders to the legacy culture and character of this region, so they are able to pass on the gift of stewardship to future generations.

The program includes five, all-day sessions that focus on faith, family, flag, friends and the future. Classes are led by a variety of community leaders and mentors from Different businesses and organizations who share real World experience, in sync

with a curriculum that inspires and informs today's youth.



All participants are high school juniors in Stone or Taney county who have demonstrated a desire to be active in school and community activities.

## THE FUTURE IS NOW. CULTIVATING TOMORROW'S LEADERS TODAY.



Ozark Mountain Legacy Young Leaders Institute is held annually at the start of each calendar year. Five different day sessions explore the traditional core values and strong character that have shaped our region, while cultivating leadership skills stem from clear vision and purpose. At the conclusion of these five sessions,

participants in the program are invited to be guests at the annual **Ozark Mountain Prayer Breakfast** where they will be recognized by the event presenters and introduced to hundreds of community members in attendance.

**SESSION 1:** THURSDAY, JAN. 22, 2026 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM **FAITH** 

The first session focuses on developing character, serving others, and leading with integrity, blending practical leadership skills with spiritual growth. Students connect their leadership journey to their personal faith walk.

- Discover how shared values unify and strengthen a community.
- Learn our area's historical roots have been guided by traditional Judeo-Christian values.
- Explore the servant leadership model that prioritizes humility and the needs of others, rather than power or control.

**SESSION 2:** THURSDAY, FEB. 26, 2026 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM



Healthy family dynamics provide the first lessons in leadership. Students will learn how self-awareness, communication, and decisionmaking influence these important, life-long relationships.

- Understand how servant leadership can shape families and other relationships throughout life.
- Experience local attractions and organizations that prioritize families and learn how they promote family values.
- Learn the foundations of healthy family, friend, and future relationships.

**SESSION 3:** THURSDAY, MARCH 12, 2026 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM

- Gather tips on planning with a mindset of continuous learning and resilience.
